During the month of February the National Laymen recognized four of their own during Black History Month.

Jerry Williams, Indianapolis, IN has served in the National Baptist Laymen's Movement for many years giving dedicated service.

He is the immediate past National Laymen treasurer, former state laymen president, immediate past Midwest Region Program Coordinator and is currently working with the state president's ministry.

James E Deen is an immediate past National Laymen Vice President. He currently gives leadership to the John L. Webb committee.

Deen is a lifetime resident of Alma, GA in Bacon County. He has spent his lifetime as an educator, a deacon at First African Baptist Church, community activist, and a politician in Alma and Bacon County. He was the first elected Black Mayor in Southeast Georgia, a 1956 graduate of Alma High School, a

member of the 1st State Basketball Championship Team in Alma/Bacon County history. He was presented the 2019 Golden Deeds Award Winner for his lifetime service and work in Alma/Bacon County.

AJ Byrd has been active in the National Baptist Laymen's Movement for many years. He is a former National King and he and his wife Theresa currently give leadership over the Juvenile Detention Ministry in the Evangelism Ministry.

Byrd completed his BA Degree at William Jewell College in Liberty, MO and completed a Master's Degree at the UMKC Block School of Business in Kansas City, MO. Byrd fresh out of William Jewell served in the US Peace Corps as a school teacher in Kenya, Africa.

His professional experience also includes 33 years with Jackson County Family Court, and 15 of those years were simultaneous with the Denver Broncos as a scout/recruiter.




