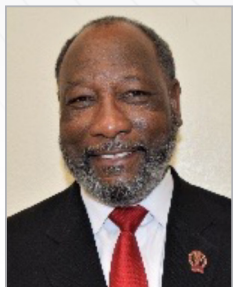

In June of 2019, the National Baptist Laymen initiated a Junior Laymen Scholarship program to increase the educational opportunities for our young men. Laymen across the country have funded these scholarships from personal sacrifices.

We have awarded 26 scholarships totaling more than \$58,500 to graduating seniors entering college. We also provide Laptop computers to each applicant awarded a scholarship. Awardees have come from the states of Alabama, Georgia, Oklahoma, Mississippi, New York, and California. In addition to those states, applicants have come from New Jersey, California, and the state of Washington. We are now making "follow-on" awards for deserving sophomores and juniors who continue to exhibit academic excellence.

These young men have gone on to attend schools like Fisk University, Georgia State, Langston University, Oklahoma State, Morehouse College, Morgan State University, Tuskegee Institute, Elizabeth State College, and University of Oklahoma. This scholarship program is designed to encourage Junior Laymen to attend college or a university as they prepare for their future career and calling.

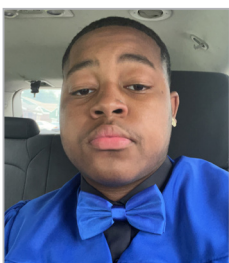

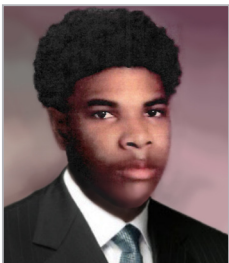

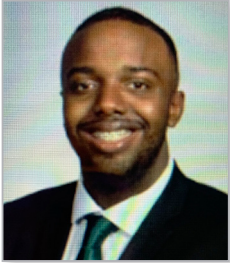

From the Journal Committee

Greetings National Baptist Convention Laymen,

In January 2018, President Willie Burke setup the Laymen's Scholarship Committee. The goal was to award three high school seniors scholarships in the amount of \$5,000, \$3,500 and \$1,500 each. All money collected was and is turned into a dedicated scholarship account and used only for this purpose. In 2018, the scholarship committee finalized the scholarship application for distribution at the 2019 Mid-Winter Board meeting.

Over the past five years, the Laymen's Auxiliary to the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc. has been providing scholarships to young men who are seniors graduating high school. The Laymen have a goal to help young men start their educational endeavors by bestowing a scholarship to an accredited school of their choice immediately after graduation. Although the number of scholarships is limited, every young man has an equal opportunity to compete and win if they meet the criteria.

While we have been successful in providing these monetary scholarships, we could not have done it without the support of generous donors, like yourself. Your support of this scholarship endeavor is very important, very much appreciated, and very much needed. The cost of a college education rises every year. Each year, it is said that thousands of students leave their higher education pursuits with serious debt – whether graduated or withdrawn. It can take years to recover from this debt and we know that those who can least afford this debt are the ones most impacted – our black and brown students. According to the Education Data Initiative, Black and African-American bachelor's degree holders have an average of \$52,000 in student loan debt. This could yield monthly payments of \$350 or higher for many years to come. This scholarship program will not erase the debt incurred by all, but it may be the difference maker in a young man deciding to pursue a college degree, continuing their degree, or helping to ease the burden and reducing their or their parents' worry about cost. Let me encourage you to continue to support these young men. The Bible tells us in Hosea 4:6, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge" and in Proverbs 4:7, "Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore, get wisdom: And with all thy getting get understanding." Let us continue to assist these young men in getting knowledge, wisdom, and understanding – an education. This is a worthwhile investment in their future and the future of so many communities. An investment that will pay great dividends in the long run.

On behalf of the Scholarship Committee and the young men who received the Junior Laymen Scholarship in the past and will receive it in the future, please accept our thanks for those of you who contributed and made this happen. I would also like for you to help us encourage others to consider donating to this worthy cause.
